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In an attempt to strengthen the quality of teaching-learning environment and curriculum, feedback regarding the curriculum was sought from faculty of MGM School of Physiotherapy.

A structured questionnaire was provided. Feedback was received from 15 participants- 12 Assistant Professors, 1 Associate Professor and 2 Professors. Action taken on feedback received from 15 participants was collated information and is presented below:

1. Curricular needs:

All teachers reported that the curriculum focuses adequately on the needs of stakeholders, national needs, and global perspectives. Also, all of them reported that course objectives and outcomes of the course were well defined and had adequate clarity.

ATR: To enhance the teaching-learning process, from the academic year 2019-2020, Credit Based Credit System Curriculum for the MPT program is implemented. This curriculum is student learning centric in nature. Choice Based Credit System is a flexible system of learning. Teachers are provided with well-defined learning objectives and course outcomes in order to plan the teaching methods to achieve the same.

2. Library facilities:

76.9% teachers agreed that sufficient numbers of prescribed books were available in the library.

ATR: Based on student strength and requirements as defined by Maharashtra State Occupational Therapy and Physiotherapy Council, books have been added to the library and additional journals have been provided. Online journals are made available for referencing.

3. Course balance and application:

92.3% teachers strongly agreed that the course curriculum had good balance between theory and application. All of them responded that adequate teaching hours were allocated in the curriculum for the various courses to ensure that core competencies were developed in students.

ATR: Implementation of the CBCS system will further enhance the core competencies with elective courses offered in order to enhance student competencies.

4. Tests and examinations:

All teachers agreed that examinations were conducted well in time with proper coverage of all units in the curriculum.

ATR: CBCS Curriculum demands a semester system with 6 monthly end semester exam which will ensure adequate coverage of curriculum. Additionally mid semester exams and continuous comprehensive evaluation is carried out to evaluate student performance.

5. Adoption of new teaching techniques:

All faculty members agreed that faculty has freedom to adopt new techniques of teaching such as seminar presentations, group discussions, and students' participation in various activities.

ATR: It is proposed to conduct teachers training course to further enhance teaching abilities.

6. Infrastructural facilities:

69.2 % teachers agreed that faculty rooms, classrooms, reading rooms, laboratories, and clinical area were adequate.

ATR: Infrastructural improvements were carried out to improve facilities offered at MGM School of Physiotherapy, with the addition of a seminar room, timely cleaning of wash rooms thrice a day and painting of all classrooms.

7. Environment:

92.3% faculty agreed that environment in the department is conducive to teaching and research.

ATR: Faculty is encouraged to pursue PhD program, apply for external funding, apply for seed grants from MGMIHS. In an attempt to encourage research initiatives incentive has been offered by MGMIHS to those faculty members who publish in pubmed and scopus indexed journal. Several faculty members have received incentives for publication in the past year and 2 faculty members have received awards for best paper publication.

8. Research support:

All the teachers agreed that management provides adequate and smooth support for projects and research facilities, research funding and support to faculty members for upgrading their skills and qualifications.

ATR: Faculty is encouraged to undertake inter disciplinary projects, apply for external funding for working on projects. State of art facility is available at MGM Center of Human Movement Science and access to international experts is made possible through MGM School of Physiotherapy through activities if International Society of Biomechanics, World Spine Care and University of Sydney.

9. Overall feedback on curriculum was reported to be good-very good by 92.3% teachers.
