A. Background

After the Gol enforcing the lockdown W.e.f. 25th March 2020 and looking at the evolving situation of the Corona 19 pandemic, it was decided to start on line lectures from 13 th April for all UG students [1st to III/ Major MBBSJ of the medical college.

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STUDENT'S FEEDBACK ON CURRICULUM REPORT

YEAR 2020-21

The Undergraduate and postgraduate students filled a total of about 108 subjects that are a part of CBCS (83 subjects) as well as Regular pattern (25 subjects) through Google forms. They responded on total 10 questions regarding the extent of coverage of course, depth of course content, Learning values and skills, availability of Practical and clinical facilities, availability of study materials, University Theory and practical exam & Internal exams, Feedback system related to student's performance in exams and opinion about extra-curricular activities. After thorough analysis, majority of the Very good to Good responses were obtained on all domains whereas satisfactory- unsatisfactory responses were obtained in domains of extend of course coverage (22.6%), depth of course content (12%), learning values(21.7%), learning skills (17.9%), adequacy of available practical facilities(19.4%), availability of clinical facilities(17.2%), availability of relevant library books(29.2%), extra-curricular activities (37.8%), University practical exam pattern (23.4%).

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STUDENT CURRICULUM- FACULTY EVALUATION BY STUDENTS

ANALYSIS REPORT

YEAR 2020-21

A total of 108 Undergraduate and Post-graduate subjects are taught been taught by approximately 65 teachers (22 teachers from Physiotherapy Department and rest from Medical department). Students have rated the faculty's performance based on the subjects taught by them. They were rated on questions related to knowledge base of teacher, preparation of teach session, communication skills, ability to answer students queries, accessibility to teacher in & out of classroom, ability to design quizzes/tests/assignment etc, fairness of teacher during assessment, etc. After thorough analysis, the maximum feedback response varied from Very good -Good (10-20%) on all the above domains for all teachers while few satisfactory to unsatisfactory responses (0-5%) were obtained on all domains for few teachers in subjects like BPME (accessibility of staff, preparation of teaching session, ability to simplify topics); Anatomy (all domains); EVS (ability to design SCMs, ability to answer queries, communication skills); Physiology(all domains); Kinesiotherapy (all domains); Thermal agents(Ability to design SCMs, preparation of teaching content, Recent advances); Kinesiology (Ability to answer student's queries); Electrotherapy (ability to integrate content with other courses, use different teaching methods, recent advances in subject), etc. the above issues were reported and discussed with Principal and a staff meeting was held for the same.

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FACULTY FEEDBACK REPORT

YEAR 2020-21

About 20 teachers have duly filled the Faulty feedback forms pertaining to 61 subjects of Physiotherapy department (59 subjects) and medical subjects (2 subjects- Surgery 1& Physiology). They responded on questions like structure of curriculum, clearly defined objectives, Course content, Correlation of assessment with syllabus and teaching learning methods, Internal assessment, implementation of Newer strategies of teaching learning methods, regular feedback and suggestions taken for curricular designing etc. After thorough analysis, the maximum feedback response varied from Very good - Good (10-20%) on all the above domains for all teachers while few satisfactory to unsatisfactory responses were obtained on domains like Freedom to adopt new teaching strategies(8.3%), allotment of work assignment (20%), relevant books in library (8.3%), regular addition of latest books(33.3%), convenience of library timings (33.3%), adequate copies of books (20%), sufficient equipment and supplies in laboratories (20%), computer facilities(44%), etc. There were suggestions by few faculty that syllabus should mention the Exam pattern of CBCS pattern looking at national & global needs and clarification for OSPE/ OSCE stations.



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PROFESSIONAL FEEDBACK REPORT (2020-21)

A total of 30 feedback forms have been filled by the external examiners for the BPT & MPT University exams conducted in the academic year 2020-21 in the print form. Their responses were based on a total of 5 questions related Curriculum design & development (Theory & practical); University Practical Exam pattern; Conduction of Examination (Student's performance; logistic arrangements for Examiner & students); Examination System (CAP, Theory paper & practical exam). The examiners reported maximum Good to Very Good responses (62-88%) on Curriculum design & Development, University Practical Exam Pattern, Conduction of Practical exam, Logistic arrangements for Examiners & students and Examination System. Majority of the examiners (95%) reported Satisfactory-Good-Very Good responses on Student's overall performance in terms of theory exams & practical exams while One Examiner was not satisfied with the Student's performance. One examiner gave positive response in terms of nice campus and good staff. The Examiner also gave few Suggestions like:

- 1. More Practical sessions for Modalities.
- 2. Upgrading of Practical Knowledge.
- 3. Increase student's clinical exposure in terms of Patient handling and treatment approaches.
- 4. Student should have proper labels of Roll number at the time of Exam as well as bring their own Assessment kits.
- 5. Separate day for CAP round and Viva Exams.



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ALUMNI FEEDBACK REPORT (2020-21)

A total of 25 Alumni students filled the Alumni Feedback form. They responded on questions related to Academic feedback (Curriculum, teaching learning methods, guidance and cooperation from faculty, Soft skills); Non-academic feedback (Classrooms, Laboratories & equipments, Sports & cultural, library facilities, campus) and general feedback (Satisfaction from Institute, Proud as an Alumni and willingness to contribute to the Institute for its development). The feedback analyses are as follows: Very good to Good responses were obtained in all the domains whereas satisfactory to unsatisfactory responses were obtained in guidance and cooperation from faculty (10%), teaching-learning methods (12%), laboratory hands on skills (12%), clinical hands on skills (20%), communication skills(4%), research skills(16.6%), working as team member (16%), planning and organizational skills(4%), computer facilities (44%), hostel (20%), mentorship programme (8%). There were a few suggestions from the Alumni students which are as follows:

Actions Taken Based on the Feedback of the Students on the Teaching Faculty

Based on the suggestions received from the students, most of the UG students wanted more of offline lectures, but taking into consideration the prevailing pandemic situation, blended mode of lectures were conducted for the studets and internship timing were kept on rotation basis to avoid crowing in the clinical areas, which also gave better exposure to the students.






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How will you rate topic wise choice of practical assessment method?



Pictorial representation of Students feedback on Curricular aspects.








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




- As compare to previous Feedback on Curriculum, it has been observed percentage of satisfaction has right shift.
