At the opening of this webinar, I would like to express my most profound gratitude to our management for their support in organizing this webinar.

It's my proud privilege to introduce the theme of the webinar organized by MGM New Bombay College of Nursing on 20th and 21st April 2021. I thank our Vice Chancellor Dr. Shashank Dalvi & Dr. Dileep Kumar, President Indian Nursing Council for accepting our invitation and to deliver the keynote address.

I am delighted to acknowledge the presence of all resource persons from our own MGM Medical College & Hospital, Navi Mumbai, Dr Jesuram Jacob from Believer's Church Medical College Kerala and two experienced Nurse Practitioners from USA.. Mrs Sheelamma Thomas from North well System Physicians Partner, New York, and Mrs Jasmine Emmanuel from Edward Hines, Jr. VA Hospital Chicago

The Indian Nursing council in 2017 introduced the path breaking competency-based Nurse Practitioner Programmes in India. In response MGM NBCON started the NPCC programme wef 15 Nov 2017.

In the beginning years training of NPCC students could be challenging, as the nursing faculty trained to suit the requirement of NPCC programme are not available. The training solely rests on a dedicated team of Medical Professionals with whom the NPCC students work intensely to get in-depth knowledge and practice skills.

At MGM, we are blessed to have a very committed team of doctors who are actively involved in training of NP students and our Medical Director, Dr. S.N. Kadam who is very liberal in providing all the support to train these students. Currently we have 6 NPs who are recruited in our ICU soon after completion of their course. I would say.... The NPs at our institute are in demand.

The Nurse Practitioner education programme have been imparted in the US, UK, Australia and Netherlands for last several decades. It was first originated in the USA in late 1960s

The concept of Nurse Practitioner in India is just in its infancy stage. We all will have to really work hard to get the NPs accepted and recognized in all the public and private sectors. We are still awaiting some legal documents from Government of India, pertaining to scope of practice of our NPs working in Critical areas.

Although we have the SOPs and protocols prepared for the NPs to practice in Critical Care Units, we still have to take help from our friends working in western countries where NP programme is well established. They have well defined roles and responsibilities; they autonomously diagnose order and interpret diagnostic tests prescribe medications and perform specific procedures within their scope of practice.

Administration of medications is one of the primary and most important responsibilities of a nurse. It is extremely important that a nurse administers safe and accurate medicines to the patients who are under her/his care.

Nurses are mostly the final person to check and see that the medications are correctly prescribed and dispensed before administration. Although drugs are routinely prescribed to the patients as primary means of therapy for the treatment of health problems but they also cause potential problems if not administered with cautions. These problems could arise from unintended consequences as well as medication errors. In a research study it was found that most common type of error was drug overdose. Second most common type of error was administering the wrong drug to the patient.

Five rights of medication administration are emphasized and made extremely important during the training of nursing students at UG level itself. The students receive adequate instructions and reinforcements regarding upholding of patient safety and about 5 Rights of Medication Administration (right patient, the right drug, the right dose, the right route, and the right time) by their teachers. Now considering various factors, more Right have been added;

- 1. Right documentation
- 2. Right medication for prescription
- 3. Right patient response
- 4. Right form of administration within a given route.

Cook et al 2006.. The essential environment condition conducive to safe medication practices which includes;

- 1. The right to complete and clearly written orders that clearly specify the drug, dose, route and frequency. (Legible Orders)
- The right to have the correct drug route and dose dispense from pharmacy. (Correct Dispensing)
- 3. The right to have access to drug information. (Timely access to information)
- 4. The right to have policies on safe medication administration.
- The right to administer medication safely and to identify problems in the system.
- 6. The right to stop think, think and be vigilant when administer medications.

To do so the nurse NP should be knowledgeable and thorough with the drugs prescribed routinely, new drugs, With emergence of novel infections (Current Pandemic), Novel drugs and Vaccines are in use for the patients infected. Nurses need more information and scientific knowledge in this area emerging area.

Scientific Sessions - Day One - 20-4-2021.

Session 1: Introduction to Pharmacology delivered by Dr. Santosh Gursale, Assistant Professor, Department of Pharmacology who gave a detailed description on the Origin of drugs, introduction to drugs, definition of the drug, Drug information sources, Nature and source of drugs and drug nomenclature. He also explained a detailed description on pharmacokinetics and pharmacodynamics.

Session 2: Leadership in Management of Medications in ICU by Ms. Jasmine Emmanuel, Nurse Practitioner from Chicago (USA) who spoke various roles and responsibilities of Nurse Practitioners in Critical Care. She emphasized that Nurse do Prescribe the drugs as per the SOP'S of each Organization. Theprimary role in critical care unit is regard to electrolyte replacement is the first priority. She discussed about various drugs used in Surgical ICU like Opioids, Narcotic pain management, Non-narcotic pain management, vasopressors, Cardiac drugs etc. She enlightened about the vital role of NP'S in the Critical Care Unit in USA.

She concluded the session by quoting, Nurses are at heart of a world -class, patient centered standard of care. Day in and Day out, they go the extra mile to make a lasting differences in the lives of the patients and their families.

Session 3: Emerging Diseases: A discussion of New and Upcoming Infections by Dr. Sagar Sinha, Professor from Department of Emergency Medicine, MGM Medical College & Hospital, Kamothe. He has given a detailed explanation of various infectious diseases which has emerged in the past and as we are facing today is COVID 19 is very miniature, when we compare with the other past infectious diseases which has emerged.

He discussed various institutional SOP'S used for the treatment of respiratory illness as the principles are the same. Newly emerging, reemerging, resurging and deliberately emerging diseases which includes Bioterrorism was discussed. Environment, animal and Vectors are responsible for the emerging Infectious disease.

He concluded by saying that we need to be prepared for any disaster which is due to Microbial host and lack of judicious use of appropriate drugs.

Session 4: Medication safety in Administration of drugs in Critical Care Units by Dr. (Lt. Gen) K.R. Salgotra, Hospital Director of MGM Medical College& Hospital, Kamothe. He said medication error is one of the major adverse eventsconsidering patient safety. He said in USA as per the statistics from research studies 25 lakh people die every year due to medication error and in India 50 lakh people die every year.

Dr. Salgotra discussed on various contributing factors of medication errors and explained in detail how can the prescribing go wrong due to inadequate knowledge about drug indication and contraindications, not considering individual patient factors such as allergies, co-morbidities, wrong patient, dose, time, route, inadequate communication, documentation and mathematical error etc. He highlighted on Look-alike and sound -alike medications. He concluded the session by saying medications need to be wisely and correctly used which can prevent human suffering and unnecessary financial cost.

Session 5: Reflections from Novice Nurse Practitioner Mrs. Sreedevi P.S who is an Alumni Nurse Practitioner of MGMNBCON and presently working as Nurse Practitioner in Critical Care unit of MGM Medical College& Hospital Kamothe Navi Mumbai. She recalled Nursing Profession in the past, present and future. She reflected her own journey as a staff nurse, senior staff nurse and today as a full-fledged Nurse Practitioner at MGM Medical College Hospital since one year. She described about the experiences acquired during two years of Nurse Practitioner Programme from 2017-2019 which was an intensive training in the critical care units, learning by observation and doing advanced procedures under the preceptor ship of Intensivists, senior residents as well as junior residents was remarkable which helped them to acquire competence and confidence in doing advancedprocedures independently. She extended her heartfelt thanks to the management for starting such an outstanding competency based Nursing Programme.

Conclusion of the session was done by Mrs. Susan Jacob, Professor MGM New Bombay College of Nursing by 1.05 -1.15 p.m.

Scientific Sessions - Day Two - 21-4-2021.

The programme started at 9.50 A.M and was moderated by Mrs.Ferganzia Jubilson, Assistant Professor MGM New Bombay College of Nursing, Kamothe.

Dr. Prabha. K. Dasila, Professor and Director, MGM New Bombay College of Nursing gave a warm welcome to all the panelist and participants.

Session1: Role of Nurse Practitioner in administering drugs in Critical Care was delivered by Mrs. Sheelamma Thomas, Nurse Practitioner in Gastroenterology, New York, USA, explained about her personal Development and experience as a Nurse Practitioner in Gastroenterology forthe past 10 years. She emphasized on the duties and responsibilities of Nurse Practitionerwhich includes conducting basic examination, advanced assessment, doing advanced procedures, makingcritical decision making in the critical care etc. She discussed common medications used in the critical care, various role of Nurse Practitioner like monitoring of patients like change in vital signs, fluid balance, alertness or orientation, side effect and desired effect of medication and monitoring injection site. She briefed about various protocols for drug administration, drug -drug interactions etc. She concluded the discussion about colorectal screening which isof paramount importance for people aged above 45 years old is made mandatory to prevent Colorectal cancer in USA to reduce the risk of Colorectal cancer.

Session 2: A Pharmacological Update in the Management of MIDr. Shilpa Kadam, Professor in Dept of Cardiology MGM Medical College Hospital explained that the heart disease is the biggest killer in India. She explained about various causes of leading cardiac risk factors, types of MI, MINOCA etc.

She discussed about golden hour of MI, routine treatment for a patient with MI which includes first priority is Oxygenation, Nitroglycerine and Morphine Sulphate. She discussed on various fibrinolytic agents, Beta blockers, Use of Low molecular weight Heparin used in MI.

Session 3: Safe Opioids Administration: How, When and When Not to Administer? Dr. Jacob Jesurun Professor & HOD, Dept. of Pharmacology Believer's Church Medical College Hospital, Kerala highlighted on the topic. He discussed in detail about various types of Opioids used in Critical Care, Mechanism of action of Opioids, and its contraindications and complications. He summarized that Opioids are used in severe pain, cough suppression and diarrhoea and highlighted 10 tips on safe opioid administration. Session 4: Novel Anticoagulants was dealt by Dr. Pradeep Jadhav Professor, Dept. of Pharmacology, MGM Medical College, Kamothe Navi Mumbai. He discussed on the properties of an ideal anticoagulant and emphasized mainly on four novel anticoagulants including apixaban, dabigatran, rivaroxaban and edoxaban which are used an alternative to warfarin which is used for high risk patients. He explained its advantages and disadvantages, drug interactions and complications.

Session 5: Trends in Pharmacovigilance in the era of COVID 19 Pandemic

Dr. Deepanjana Dass Assistant Professor, Dept. of Pharmacology, MGM Medical College, Navi Mumbai elaborated on the topic where, she highlighted the meaning of pharmacovigilance which is the science and activities relating to the detection, assessment, understanding and prevention of adverse effects or any other drug related problems. She stressed on the main focus of pharmacovigilance is on Adverse drug reactions, drug toxicity andhighlighted on the key areas of pharmacovigilance which includes National drug policy, Drug regulation, Clinical Practice, Public health Programme and Benefits from dedicated Pharmacovigilance resources. She Concluded by explaining six biggest trends in pharmacovigilance which consists of role of pharmacovigilance in the pandemic of this magnitude, Artificial intelligence in adverse Drug Reaction processing in the era of COVID19 Pandemic, Machine Learning Algorithm used in drug safety and ensure administering drugs, New challenges in drug safety, monitoring the safety of biological medicines and gene therapy.

Session 6: End of Life Care: Pain and Symptom Managementwas delivered byDr. Sucheet Avanti, Assistant Professor, Dept. of Emergency Medicine, MGM Medical College& Hospital, Kamothe, Navi Mumbai.He stressed on Pain management, discussed about the use of opioids on pain management. He discussed on the importance of palliative sedationon Palliative care and hospice care. He also stressed on the Basics of Pain Management by using pain scale, WHO pain ladder etc.

Session7: Simulation Based Training: Application in Clinical Pharmacologywas dealt byDr. Vishwas Sathe Professor, Department of Anaesthesia, MGM Medical College& Hospital, Navi Mumbai. He discussed on Simulation as a method of training and highlighted the role of simulation in health professional education, He concluded that simulation has significant potential to address the challenges in today's provision of clinical pharmacology education, especially with new directives for social distancing and limitations for in- personal engagement.





The Programme started by the moderator, Mrs. Sarika Sukesh Nair, Nursing Tutor at 10.00 am with a warm welcome to all the panelists and the participants who were present virtually on the day of the webinar. The Honorable Principal, Dr. Prabha K. Dasila, welcomed all the participants for the webinar and introduced the importance of the webinar.

The theme for the webinar was unfolded by Dr. R. Ponchitra, Professor and Vice Principal, MGM New Bombay College of Nursing. She gave a brief description of the current pandemic that had affected the whole world and also highlighted about the devastating changes in the progression of the disease. The importance of updating knowledge in terms of management of the disease progression is of highest priority especially for nurses who cares for those patients affected badly during this COVID 19 pandemic.

Unfolding the Theme

Good morning to all Experts and delegates.

"It much more important to know what sort of a patient has a disease than what sort of a .disease patient has." By William Osler.

Human to human transmitted disease is the game of coronavirus disease (COVID-19) transmission and it had been declared an emergency global pandemic that caused major disastrous in the respiratory system to more than five million people and killing more than half a billion deaths across the globe. These patients have been discovered to develop a wide range of bacterial and fungal co-infections and in the recent days we've been seeing a sudden increase in the Mucormycosis infection in the COVID patients.

Mucormycosis is an angio invasive disease caused by saprophytic fungi of the order mucorales. The exact incidence of mucormycosis in India is unknown due to lack of population based studies. The estimated prevalence of mucormycosis is around 70 times higher in India than that in global data.

In history the annual incidence of mucormycosis reported from different case series from India by Chakrabarti et al showed an annual incidence of 12.9 cases per yearduring1990-1999, 35.6 cases per year during 2000-2004 and 50 cases per year during 2006-2007 at a single centre. A multi-centre study across India reported 465 cases from 12 centres over 21 months.

The clinical presentations of mucormycosis are classified on the basis of anatomical localisation, such as Rhino- orbital- cerebral (ROCM) the commonest form, followed by cutaneous, pulmonary, renal, gastrointestinal, and disseminated infections. Other unusual sites of infection reported in the literature from India are breast, ear, spine, heart and bone infections.

Though mucormycosis is globally distributed, certain risk factors, clinical forms and causative agents of the disease are prevalent in India. Uncontrolled diabetes mellitus is the most common underlying disease associated with mucormycosis in India in contrast to haematological- malignancy patients and solid organ transplant recipients in developed countries. The possible reason for the high prevalence is the abundant presence of Mucorales in the community and hospital environment, large number of susceptible hosts especially DM and neglect for regular health check-ups of Indian Population.

In the current scenario it has been understood that this black fungus called mucormycosis is complicating the treatment and recovery of COVID-19 patients. Mucormycosis, a serious fungal infection but otherwise rare, has been observed in a number of Covid-19 patients recently. While there is no major outbreak, the national Covid task force has issued advisory guidelines on this deadly disease.

Focussing on the current health care scenario and the necessity of preparation to handle this newly emerged dreadful disease this webinar is organised with the theme "All about Mucormycosis in Covid -19".

The webinar focuses to emphasize on understanding about mucormycosis infections and its preventive strategies. The sessions focus on

What is the disease? Why has it emerged now? What is its relation with Covid -19?

What are the major risk factors? Who is at risk or vulnerable? What are its major types? What happens when one contracts it? When to suspect? What is the treatment/management?

How can one prevent it? What should be done to prevent Mucormycosis? What is the role of the nurse in monitoring and preventing Mucormycosis?

Session 1 on Mucormycosis and its progression was delivered by Dr. Badal Taori and Dr. Saurabh Borkhade, Senior Residents, Dept of Medicine, who gave a detailed description on the pathogenesis of mucormycosis infection. The clinical forms of mucormycosis such as pulmonary, gastrointestinal, cutaneous and disseminated mucormycosis was explained in detail with regards to its invasion, internal progression of disease, diagnostic measures and both medical and surgical management. The session emphasized on the key points such as nursing considerations in terms of COVID patient care which could also be beneficial for decrease in the chances of infection.

Session 2 (Part 1) on Symptoms and management (Orbital mucormycosis) was delivered by Ms. Sayali Amberkar, Senior Resident, Dept of Ophthalmology. She gave a detailed explanation of the invasion of the disease and its progression to nose, sinus, eyes and CNS. The warning symptoms were briefly highlighted, including the general features in the 4 stages of rhino orbito cerebral mucormycosis. She concluded the session emphasizing the importance of multidisciplinary approach in ROCM wherein both medical, surgical and nursing management plays a vital role.

Session 2 (Part 2) on Symptoms and management (Rhinocerebral mucormycosis) by Ms. Aathira Thomas, Senior Resident, Dept of ENT, was focused on pathogenesis of mucormycosis in the nose, sinus and CNS. She emphasized on the importance of identifying and keeping a high risk of suspicion to diagnose the patient and implement appropriate line of management for the same. She highlighted the importance of nurses being very vigilant and observant during a clients hospital stay and also ensuring proper practice of protocols regarding oxygen administration.

Session 3 on Diagnostic considerations in mucormycosis (Investigations and sample collection) Dr. Deepashri Naik, Associate Professor, Dept of microbiology, gave a detailed overview of diagnostic approaches in COVID 19, wherein the importance of punch biopsy, fungal stain and culture, histological examination, CT scan, biopsy and other blood parameter assessment such as XBC, ABG, RBS was emphasized.







Coronavirus disease (COVID-19) is an infectious disease caused by the SARS-CoV-2 virus. Most people infected with the virus will experience mild to moderate respiratory illness and recover without requiring special treatment. However, some will become seriously ill and require medical attention

So far, data suggests that children under the age of 18 years represent about 8.5% of reported cases, with relatively few deaths compared to other age groups and usually mild disease. However, cases of critical illness have been reported. As with adults, pre-existing medical conditions have been suggested as a risk factor for severe disease and intensive care admission in children. As children generally have milder illness and fewer symptoms, cases may sometimes go unnoticed. Importantly, early data from studies suggest that infection rates among teenagers may be higher than in younger children.

WHO is bringing the world's scientists and global health professionals together to accelerate the research and development process, and develop new norms and standards to contain the spread of the coronavirus pandemic and help care for those affected.

Session 1: Preparation for the management of children with Covid 19, Dr Vijay Kamale, Professor and HOD, Department of Pediatrics, MGM Hospital, Kamothe

Dr. Vijay Kamale have given a clear picture about the management of children in COVID 19 pandemic. He emphasized that a small proportion of symptomatic children (10-20%) may need hospitalization for Covid infection and 1-3% of symptomatic children may have severe illness and may require intensive care admission. The incubation period for covid infection in children may be from 2- 14 days. He showed his concern about the most serious complication of covid 19 infection in children, that is MISC. He anticipated about the emergence of third wave of the infection from September to October 2021.

Session 2: Mild COVID, Dr Jithendra Gavhnae, Professor and PICU In charge, Department of Pediatrics, MGM Hospital, Kamothe


Dr Jithendra Gavhnae started with a note about the third wave preparation of covid 19 by the health care professionals. He gave an idea about the Pediatric covid 19 Field training workshop done by the Government of Maharashtra Task Force for pediatric covid 19 constituted by the Hon. Chief Minister of Maharashtra, Shri Uddhav Thackeray. He categorized the Covid 19 in children into Acute covid illness and Multisystem inflammatory syndrome of children with covid 19. The he moved on to his topic, management of children with Mild covid. Home care management is recommended for children with Mild covid and need to teach the parents about the Red flag signs like Persistent fever > 3 days, decrease urine output, lethargy, drowsiness, rapid breathing, Rashes and convulsions. The child with mild covid can be full normal diet with continued breastfeeding. No antibiotics and no investigations are recommended. Warm saline gargles can be provided to older children.

Session 3: Moderate COVID, Dr. Revathi N, Associate Professor, Department of Pediatrics, MGM Hospital, Kamothe

Dr. Revathi N had given a clear picture about the management of Moderate Covid19 in children. She started the session with the discussion of various case scenarios on moderate covid in children. The child with moderate covid will be admitted in the pediatric ward. Necessary investigations should be done. The investigation should include CBC, CRP,SGPT, Serum Albumin, Serum creatinine and X ray chest. The child should be monitored regularly. TPR 4 hourly, BP 8 hourly and SPO₂ 2 hourly. Supportive care for the child includes hydration, nutrition and antimicrobials (Ceftriaxone 75-100 mg/kg/day). We need to continue with the treatment of comorbidities, if any. The Spo₂ level between 90-94% should be manages with oxygen therapy, awake proning technique, IV Dexamethasone 0.15 mg/kg/dose. The discharge criteria are as follows: No fever for more than 3 days, 10 days from onset of the symptoms, defer vaccination after 4 weeks, ensure completion of routine vaccines. If Spo₂ is less than 90%/ severe pneumonia/evidence of shock/ refractive convulsions are the criteria for transferring the child to HDU/PICU.

Session 4- Severe COVID, Dr. Suhas Kharche, Assistant Professor, Department of Pediatrics, MGM Hospital, Kamothe

Dr. Suhas Kharche started with the session by enumerating and explaining the line of treatment for managing children with severe covid 19. Children need to be admitted in PICU/HDU. CBC, RFT, LFT, CRP, Procal D-Dimer, Lactate, ECG and chest xay are the first line investigations to rule out the complications and severity of covid. Optimize oxygen level and if needed High flow nasal cannula, CPAP, NIV and invasive ventilation can be opted as per the condition of the child. Consider prone positioning, restrictive fluid therapy. The drug of choice are IV steroids, Remdesivir, Enoxaparin and Antimicrobials. Explained the whole concept with various case scenarios. He had a detailed explanation about the identification criteria for Multisystem inflammatory syndrome in children as a complication of COVID 19. The criteria are as follows: Fever> 3 days, uticarial rashes, bilateral non purulent



conjunctivitis, red lips, inflammation of hands and feet, BCG scar reactivation, acute GI symptoms, H/O Covid or close contact with covid in previous 5 months. MISC can be presented in the form of Febrile inflammatory syndrome, Kawasaki disease like presentation and shock with MODS.

Session 5- Psychological issues of children during COVID 19 Pandemic, Dr Vijay Kamale, Professor and HOD, Department of Pediatrics, MGM Hospital, Kamothe

Dr. Vijay Kamale insisted all the health care professionals to teach the parents to watch for the psychological ill effects of covid 19 pandemic as well as due to the lock down in children. The various behavioural changes that we can expect from children are irritability, anger, frustration, wants to cling to the mother all the time, Regressive behaviours like thumb sucking, bedwetting etc, Change in diet pattern and episodes of crying spells. It is the responsibility of the health care members to provide advice to all the parents, the ways to manage the psychological health of children during the pandemic. We should encourage the parents to spend valuable time with the kids, listen to them patiently, involve the children in daily chores and to appreciate their work. Doctors should make sure that the psychological health of children are taken care of during consultation either through online or offline.



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Scientific sessions- Day Two- 18.06.2021.

The programme started at 2.00 P.M and was moderated by Ms. Dipali Pingale, Tutor, MGM New Bombay College of Nursing, Kamothe

Dr. Prabha K Dasila, Professor and Director, MGM New Bombay College of Nursing gave a warm welcome to all the panelists and the participants.

Session 1- Preparation for the management of children with Covid 19, Dr Vijay Kamale, Professor and HOD, Department of Pediatrics, MGM Hospital, Kamothe

Dr. Vijay Kamale gave a brief description about the sessions planned for Day 2. He expressed the expectations about the third wave of Covid 19, which is expected to affect nearly 20% of the population. We are expecting probably three admissions per day for the third wave. It is our responsibility to prepare the pediatric department of our hospital in order to receive the expected number of pediatric patients. Our hospital is planning for 70 bedded pediatric unit for Covid affected children. Out of 70 beds, 30 beds will be allotted for Intensive care unit and for HDU. Remaining 40 beds to provide moderate care to pediatric population with Covid 19.

Session 2- Devices and equipments used in the management of children with COVID 19, Dr. Suhas Kharche, Assistant Professor, Department of Pediatrics, MGM Hospital, Kamothe

Dr Suhas Kharche shared his knowledge regarding various devices and equipments used in managing the children in critical care units and in the wards. The equipments and devices used in children are entirely different from that of adults specially on its size. The devices and equipments are mainly catagorized in to Airway and resuscitation equipments, Respiratory support devices, Temperature regulating devices and Monitoring devices. Airway devices includes oral airway, endotracheal tube and laryngeal mask airway. Resuscitation equipments consists of AMBU Bag, face mask and laryngoscope. Respiratory devices are divided into High flow nasal cannula and Non invasive ventilation mask. Temperature regulating devices includes Warm water Blankets, IV fluid warmers and Heat moist exchangers.

Session 3- Common drugs and fluid calculations for children- Dr Prakruthi K.D, Assistant Professor, Department of Pediatrics, MGM Hospital, Kamothe

Dr Prakruthi K.D elaborated about common drugs and fluid calculations in Pediatrics. She laid the importance of drug and fluid calculations when taking care of a child. She mentioned that the drug dosages will be recommended on the basis of Body weight in kilograms and Body surface area. She clearly explained about the units of measurements and its conversion which is the first step of drug calculation. She also discussed about various formulas for calculating the drugs and fluid based on the prescribed dosages for children. Each topic was followed by various examples for the casy understanding of the students. She explained about the commonly used drugs in children and its dosages. Paracetamol- 10-15 mg/kg/dose, Amoxicillin- 25-50 mg/kg/day, Cetrizine- > 6 months to 2 year- 2.5 mg, 2-5 years- 5 mg, 5-12 years- 5-10 mg. Pediatric drip set and infusion pump are the devices used to administer the fluids and drugs.

Session 4- Nutritional management of children with COVID 19, Dr. Sindhu Thomas, Assistant Professor, MGM New Bombay college of Nursing

Dr Sindhu Thomas shared her knowledge on the nutritional management of chid during Covid 19. She laid down the importance of breast feeding and proper complementary feeding practices as a preventive factor for Covid 19 infection. If a mother is covid positive and the baby is covid negative, the mother can breast feed the infant by maintaining proper respiratory etiquettes. Rooming in can be practiced between the baby and the mother with 6 feet distance. Mother should wear mask properly. Watch for

the signs of infection in the child often. Expressed breast milk is also a best option If the mother is covid positive. All recommended Infant and young child feeding practices remain the same based on the global guidelines. Principles of complementary feeding also remains the same in case if the mother is infected. High calorie and high protein diet is recommended for the child who is covid positive. The mother should watch for the red flag signs during the home care management. Childhood obesity is also a concern during the covid lock down. Parents should create opportunities for the children for any kind of physical activities for their children during the lock down.

Session 5- Nursing management of critically ill children with COVID 19 infection, Dr Padmaja Dhawale, Associate Professor, MGM New Bombay College of Nursing, Kamothe

Dr. Padmaja Dhawale focussed about the family centered nursing care during the management of critically ill child with Covid 19 infection. Parent education and assurance is a key element in the nursing care. Mild covid will be treated at home. Home care management measures should be explained for to the parents including the respiratory etiquettes. Complete and continuous nursing care is required for children with moderate to severe illness and is admitted in ICU. ICU unit should be well equipped with adequate doctors, nurses and also with necessary devices and equipments. Soon after admitting the child to ICU, a quick physical assessment is mandatory after collecting thorough history from the parents, which is followed by a systemic examination. Continuous monitoring and the respiratory care are the paramount of the nursing care of the child in ICU. Fluid and electrolyte balance, bowel and bladder care, dressing and wound care, neuromuscular care, promotes comfort and reassurance are also the various aspects involved in the nursing care.


Session 6- Resuscitation in COVID 19 child and measures, Dr. Amol M, Assistant Professor, Dr. Priyanka A, Senior Resident, Department of Pediatrics, MGM Hospital, Kamothe.

Dr Amol and Dr Priyanka explained very well about the procedure for resuscitating the children with Covid 19. Resuscitation in covid 19 possess a significant risk for health care workers due to aerosol generation. Ten recommendations on the general principles for resuscitation to be followed during Covid 19 pandemic. They discussed about Prone CPR, equipment selections and the various drugs used in resuscitation of children.



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

















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




