Only NMC required staff is available which is sufficient only for MBBS teaching. In view where we have so many additional courses this number of staffs is not enough if good quality work is to be done. In terms of workload and man power ratio, on medical college faculties, it is always considered the relative work load of medical college only, but same medical college facilities are involved with teaching and assessment of all other programs running with in the campus like BPth, Dental, BSc, MSc, Nursing, PhD. (It is like we are working for 4-5 colleges simultaneously) along with all the university and exam section work. To have a work friendly Institute. 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#### ATR on Students Feedback (2022-23)

In an attempt to strengthen the quality of teaching-learning environment and curriculum, beneficiaries of the teaching programs viz. students from MGM School of Physiotherapy were approached to provide information regarding curriculum and teaching environment. A structured questionnaire was shared with the BPT and MPT students. 352 students (326 BPT; 26MPT) gave feedback on curriculum, 1 hostel-based student (BPT) and 362 students (336 BPT and 26 MPT students) gave feedback on Infrastructure and facilities.

#### Summary of feedback provided by students:

Curriculum: 92.9% students reported that extent of coverage of course was satisfactory to very good. 93.7% of students reported depth of Course content was satisfactory to very good. Applicability /relevance of curriculum in real life situations were reported to be satisfactory to very good by 96.3% of students. 93.4% of students reported learning Values (in terms of Attitude, Ethics, broadening perspectives) was satisfactory to very good. 95.5% students reported learning Skills (in terms of Practical, Communication, Team work, Leadership, Research) was satisfactory to very good. 89.1% of students reported Adequacy of available practical facilities in terms of curriculum was satisfactory to very good. 96% students reported adequacy of available clinical facilities in terms of curriculum to be satisfactory to very good. 93.4% students reported relevance and adequacy of available Library books and resource material in terms of curriculum was satisfactory to very good. 94.8% of students rated University theory exam paper content with respect to curriculum coverage to be satisfactory to very good. 94.1% students reported University practical exam content and conduct with respect to curriculum coverage was satisfactory to very good. 96.1% students reported about content and conduct of various internal examinations to be satisfactory to very good. 85.2% reported their opinion about extracurricular activities to be satisfactory to very good.

Hostel and Mess: (1 response) 100 % agreed that the hostel rooms are clean and well maintained, has good security system; Mess is clean and well maintained and Warden is approachable and helpful. 100 % disagreed that Clean drinking water is available; Hostel has adequate power supply; buildings are disabled friendly – lifts

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and ramps are placed where necessary; Toilets and washrooms are clean and properly maintained and Sanitary napkin dispenser machines are available

Campus: 48.9% students agreed that clean drinking water is available on campus. 32.3% students agreed that campus has adequate power supply. 67.9% students reported that campus has good security system. 51.6% students agreed that parking is available for students. 69.6% students agreed that campus is disabled friendly – lifts and ramps are placed where necessary. 18.2% % students reported that toilets and washrooms are clean and properly maintained. 8.6% students agreed that sanitary napkin dispenser machines are available 56.1% students agreed that canteen is clean and well maintained. 64.9% students agreed that food available in canteen nutritious and hygienically presented. 59.9% students agreed that kitchen and cutlery of canteen is clean with maintained hygiene 56.7 % students agreed that classrooms are clean and properly maintained. 34.5% students agreed that separate common rooms for boys and girls are available. 39.8% students agreed that good response is available from reception / Help desk. 87.3% students agreed that campus is green and eco-friendly.

#### ATR at Institutional Level:

- Students are offered greater academic flexibility by encouraging enrollment in different courses offered online
  through platform like Swayam to enhance application of curriculum to real life situations, local developmental
  needs, employability and entrepreneurship.
- To enhance student skill training following workshops were conducted like Physiotherapy in ICU: Simulation based Skill training. 3 D Analysis and Clinical biomechanics have been conducted in month of January 2023 and February 2023
- Infra structural changes have been brought about to improve facilities offered at MGM School of
  Physiotherapy, with the addition of a seminar room, e-learning laboratory, simulation laboratory, timely
  cleaning of wash rooms thrice a day and painting of all classrooms. AC unit has been installed in one
  classroom, for other classrooms it is in process. Additionally, Medical seminar hall and engineering
  classrooms (which are spacious and with AC facility) are utilized for student comfort.
- Electricity generator is installed to resolve load shedding issue.

- 2) Non-Academic Feedback: Library 72.2 % faculty agreed that relevant books are available as listed in the curriculum. 50 % agreed that latest editions of books are added regularly.50% agreed that adequate copies of Books are stocked. 72.2 % agreed latest Journals are subscribed.94.5% agreed that library timing is convenient
- 3) Non Academic Feedback: infrastructure and facilities 44.4 % faculty agreed that physical set up of the institute is conducive. 61.1 % agreed that maintenance of physical set up is satisfactory. 67.7 % agreed that equipment and supplies in the laboratory are sufficient. 38.9 % agreed that computer facilities are adequate
- 4) General feedback: Interpersonal relationship 83.3 % agreed that there is Team spirit & cordial work relationship amongst staff (Teaching & Administrative). 83.4 % agreed that there is a good support system amongst colleagues and from Institutional authorities as and when needed
- 5) General feedback: Work culture & Benefits 67.7% agreed that opportunities are provided for professional growth. 77.8 % agreed that there is established research system which appreciates and supports new ideas. 27.8 % agreed that flexibility to balance family and work life is provided. 61.1 % agreed that recognition for achievement is provided.62.1% agreed that feedback is provided on the performance. 27.8 % agreed that remuneration is satisfactory



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# ATR at Institutional Level:

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#### I - Curricular aspect

#### Action taken:

The traditional healthcare care education system does not cater to the expectations of all stakeholders of health education. While it tries to bring about parity in output, the rigid system fails on many counts at the input level. With the ever-changing scenario, arises the need for an innovative education practices. MGMSBS has already adopted the CBCS pattern of curriculum as per the University Grants Commission (UGC) initiative, to to bring equity, efficiency and excellence in the Higher Education System. MGMSBS has taken the proactive lead in bringing about the academic reform of introducing CBCS semester wise pattern for existing UG, PG & PhD courses.

Looking at the specific remarks in the feedback taken below is the action taken,

- we have got books approved particulary for MSc Clinical Nutrition and Optometry students in the library.
- with regards to the external internship, there already exist a provision as approved in our BOM that students can persue 50% internship in external institutes / laboratories, subject to the institute following the rules as set by MGMIHS. In addition, our MSc sudent are also posted in the MGM sister concern hospitals like, MGM Vashi, MGM Belapur and MGM Kalamboli routinely.
- To cater to the increased number of student and the courses post implementation of the CBCS curriculum, we have tried to recruit minimum one coordinator per program at MGMSBS, NM.
- MGM SBS caters to the lower economic strata of the student and looking at their financial status we had taken the initiative of providing basic stipend to the UG Interns, but that was not approved by the BOM.
- Any departmental complained received by the students or interns are directly forwed to the Dean, Medical college and hospital for resolution

During COVID majority of the conferences were in an online format, but now there are a lot of conferences and workshops being conducted by various institutes. We are encouraging our students to participate in various such activities like conferences, seminars, workshops, poster presentations, paper presentations etc. and also participate in inter and intra college fest. Some of the students have shown interest toward implementing holistic learning and such students are motivated to participate in value based workshops to develop an all-round personality of the students.

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#### B) Students feedback on the teaching faculty Action taken:

Most of the students have appreciated the ability of taking tests and assignments after the sessions. More than 55% students feel that, the teacher's internal assessment process was good. But 5-6% of them feel improvements in the process of internal assessment. Therefore, it is recommended to the teachers to improve the process of internal assessment of the student. Feedback and Guidance play a vital role in the development of students learning process. It was found that, over 50% students were satisfied with feedback and guidance by the teachers for their evaluation. It was observed that, over 60% students feel the overall ratings of the teacher was good. There is a scope for further improvement here and hence it is recommended to the teachers to enhance their overall effectiveness.


