I - Curricular aspect



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Feedback:

A total of 307 students participated in the feedback process, offering insights into various aspects of the curriculum. The majority of students rated the course coverage, depth of content, and applicability of the curriculum to real-life situations as either *Very Good* or *Good*. Specifically, around 47-50% of students found the course content comprehensive, relevant, and well-delivered, while a smaller percentage (around 28%) considered these areas *Satisfactory*, indicating room for improvement.

The learning experience, including the development of skills such as communication, teamwork, leadership, and practical abilities, was also positively viewed. However, there is an opportunity to strengthen these areas, as a notable portion (approximately 34%) felt that practical skill-building could be further enhanced. Similarly, while students rated the learning values of attitude, ethics, and broadening perspectives favorably, many emphasized the need for more real-world applications and engagement.

Facilities, both practical and clinical, received mixed feedback. While 46-47% of respondents rated the adequacy of these facilities as *Good*, around 26-29% rated them as *Satisfactory*, signaling a need for improvement. Many students also expressed the need for better infrastructure, such as more classrooms, better seating arrangements, and enhanced lab and clinical spaces.

The availability of library resources was generally well-received, though 30% of students rated it as *Satisfactory*, suggesting that access to current materials could be expanded. Similarly, the examinations—both theoretical and practical—were mostly rated as *Good*, with concerns primarily centered around exam difficulty, clarity, and alignment with the course content.

While internal examinations and feedback were deemed satisfactory, with 54.7% rating them as *Good*, students expressed a desire for quicker, more detailed feedback. Extracurricular activities, while positively rated by a portion of students, were noted as an area for growth, with a significant portion (45.9%) marking them as *Satisfactory*.

In terms of suggestions for improvement, common themes included a stronger emphasis on practical learning opportunities, more hands-on sessions, and increased faculty support. Students also advocated for better career guidance, mentorship programs, and greater participation in extracurricular activities. Improving infrastructure—particularly in terms of classroom conditions and clinical resources—was another frequent request.



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The feedback overall suggests a positive learning environment, with a focus on continual improvement. Common themes include the desire for more practical exposure, additional resources in the library, and streamlined administrative processes.

B) Students feedback on the teaching faculty

A total of 257 students reverted on the feedback relating to the teaching faculty.

An effort was made to access the student feedback on teachers teaching various courses. Students were asked to judge the teachers on about 19 questions. Various aspects were covered like:

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Feedback:

Based on the feedback from 257 students across 19 evaluation points, the overall perception of teaching quality is positive, with several strengths noted, as well as areas that could be further enhanced. The majority of students rated their learning experience favorably, highlighting strong teaching knowledge, communication skills, and engagement. Below is the consolidated summary of key themes from the feedback:

Teachers were largely praised for their depth of knowledge, with 62.7% of students rating the teachers' knowledge as *Very Good* or *Good*. The preparation of teaching sessions also received high marks, with the majority of responses indicating that teachers came well-prepared for classes. This suggests that the faculty is generally competent and committed to delivering quality content.

Teachers' ability to communicate effectively was rated positively by the students, with approximately 70-80% of respondents across all groups rating articulation and comprehensibility as *Very Good* or *Good*. The content of the sessions was considered relevant and aligned with the curriculum, with a large portion of students (about 70%) indicating satisfaction with the teaching material's quality. However, a small number of students (around 15-20%) felt that further improvements could be made in simplifying and explaining certain complex topics more clearly.

Teachers were successful in generating interest in the subjects, with **over 60%** of students across all groups feeling motivated during sessions. The ability to involve students in discussions and activities was generally rated as *Good* or *Very Good*, though there was some room for improvement, particularly in increasing student participation and fostering more interaction during sessions. Around **10-15%** of students expressed that teachers could improve in this area. The use of diverse teaching methods was seen as a strength, although some students felt that more varied or innovative techniques could be introduced. The pacing of lessons received positive feedback, with **approximately 70%** of students rating the pace as *Good* or *Very Good*, suggesting that lessons are generally delivered at an appropriate speed. However, a small segment of students (**10-15%**) felt that the pace could be adjusted for better comprehension, especially for more complex

The fairness of assessments and the ability of teachers to design effective quizzes and assignments were highly rated, with **about 70%** of students marking this aspect as *Good* or *Very Good*. Similarly, feedback on assessments was deemed generally timely and constructive, although some students expressed a desire for more detailed and frequent feedback to better track their progress. Teachers were largely accessible for academic guidance, both during and outside of class hours,



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with **approximately 70-80%** of students rating teacher accessibility as *Good* or *Very Good*. However, there were some slight concerns regarding the availability of teachers, particularly in certain groups, indicating that further improvements could be made in ensuring consistent accessibility across all teaching staff. Teachers were commended for providing a broader perspective and integrating recent advances into the course material. However, there were some comments suggesting that there could be a stronger emphasis on current developments in the field, particularly in group D, where the integration of recent trends was rated lower.

Overall, students expressed a high level of satisfaction with the teaching quality, with most rating their learning experience as *Good* or *Very Good* across multiple categories. Teachers were recognized for their strong knowledge base, effective communication, and motivation. The primary areas for improvement include increasing student participation, diversifying teaching methods, ensuring timely and more detailed feedback, and enhancing teacher accessibility for academic guidance. Additionally, there is a need to integrate more recent developments into the course material and adjust the pace of some lessons for better comprehension. This feedback provides valuable insights into the strengths of the teaching team, while also highlighting areas for further development to enhance the overall student experience.

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Summary of the feedback

Academic: The feedback data for the curriculum and syllabus reveals that most ratings fall between "Very good" and "Good," with some instances of "Satisfactory" and "Unsatisfactory." The curriculum and syllabus relevance for future plans is generally rated as "Very good" or "Good," with isolated "Satisfactory" and "Unsatisfactory" ratings. The feedback also shows mixed experiences in laboratory hands-on skill development and clinical hands-on skill development. Faculty guidance and cooperation are largely "Very good" and "Good," indicating strong faculty support. The teaching-learning methods used by the faculty are primarily rated "Very good" or "Good," with some "Satisfactory" responses. Communication skills, teamwork, leadership, research, and planning and organizing skills are rated as "Very good" and "Good," with some "Satisfactory" and "Unsatisfactory" responses. Addressing these areas could lead to a more balanced and well-rounded educational experience for students.

Non academic feedback: The feedback for various facilities in the university reveals a wide range of ratings, with many indicating "Good" and "Very good." The majority of responses rate lab facilities as "Good" or "Very good," indicating satisfaction with the facilities. However, occasional "Satisfactory" and "Unsatisfactory" ratings suggest inconsistencies in equipment quality or availability. Computer facilities are mostly rated "Good" or "Very good," with some entries being "Satisfactory" or "Unsatisfactory." Sports and cultural facilities are generally positive, but occasional "Satisfactory" and "Unsatisfactory" responses indicate a need for upgrades or increased support. Library facilities are generally good, with some "Satisfactory" ratings suggesting that certain resources or seating arrangements could be improved. Most responses are "Good" or "Very good," with some "Satisfactory" and "Unsatisfactory" ratings. The mentoring program experience is also rated as "Good" to "Very good," with some "Satisfactory" and "Unsatisfactory" responses suggesting personalized guidance or consistent mentor availability.

Other aspects: The report reveals the satisfaction and pride of alumni with their association with the institute. The majority rated their satisfaction as "Very Good" or "Good," with some stating "Unsatisfactory." The institute has implemented a feedback mechanism to address alumni concerns, prioritizing improvements in facilities, infrastructure, and academic resources. An advisory council has been established to provide ongoing feedback on institutional improvements.

Feeling a strong sense of institutional loyalty, the institute has established an Alumni Recognition Program to celebrate distinguished alumni's achievements and enhance the institute's reputation



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in the community and industry. A significant number of alumni expressed willingness to contribute to the institute's development in various ways. An Alumni Engagement Program was launched to coordinate contributions and maintain contact with interested alumni.

Preferred modes of contribution include employment opportunities, guidance to students, guest lectures, research collaborations, scholarships/medals, infrastructure development, and extension activities. An Alumni Job Board was created to post job openings and internship opportunities, a mentorship program for alumni to volunteer, guest lecture series, a partnership initiative for alumni to participate in collaborative research, an Alumni Scholarship Fund for scholarships, and connections with the infrastructure planning team for potential contributions.

STUDENT'S FEEDBACK ON CURRICULUM ANALYSIS REPORT

YEAR 2023-24

The Undergraduate of II Sem AHS, III Sem AHS, VI Sem AHS, III Year AHS, IV Year AHS and postgraduate students of II Sem AHS & IV Sem AHS total no of 181 students filled the Google based feedback forms on curriculum. They responded on total 10 questions regarding the extent of coverage of course, depth of course content, Learning values and skills, availability of Practical and clinical facilities, availability of study materials, University Theory and practical exam &Internal exams, Feedback system related to student's performance in exams and opinion about extra-curricular activities. After thorough analysis, Very good, Good& Satisfactory responses were obtained on all domains whereas Unsatisfactory responses were obtained in domains of extend of course coverage (7.1% - II Sem AHS), depth of course content (5% -VI Sem AHS), learning values(4.4% - II, II, VI Sem AHS), learning skills (9.1% - III, VI Sem AHS), applicability of syllabus in real life (7.7% - VI Sem AHS), adequacy of available practical facilities(12.8% II, III, VI Sem AHS), availability of clinical facilities(10.1% - II, VI Sem AHS), availability of relevant library books(9.7%), extra-curricular activities (12.1%), University Theory exam content (5.7%- II Sem AHS). These lacunas were discussed with Principal and suggestions given were:-

- 1. Lecture sessions will be conducted for 45 mins to maintain Student's concentration as well as complete syllabus on time.
- 2. Saturdays will be dedicated for extracurricular activities like aerobics, yoga, trekking, creative skills (craft, drawing)
- 3. Efforts are taken to focus on more practical based learning.
- 4. Arrangement of camps and student out postings for from V Sem AHS onwards for exposure in Community PT based subjects
- 5. PGs will be involved in teaching topics for AHS students in OPD & classrooms in subjects like Anatomy, Physiology, Biochemistry, IHMS -II.

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- 6. Class incharges are instructed to monitor the everyday lecture schedule and attendance of the students and post it in Parents Whatsapp group.

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FACULTY FEEDBACK ANALYSIS REPORT

About 5 teachers have duly filled the Faulty feedback forms. They responded on questions like structure of curriculum, clearly defined objectives, Course content, Correlation of assessment with syllabus and teaching learning methods, Internal assessment, implementation of Newer strategies of teaching learning methods, regular feedback and suggestions taken for curricular designing etc. After thorough analysis, the maximum feedback response varied from Strongly agree - Neutral responses (50-92%) on all the above domains for all teachers while few negative responses were obtained on domains like Structure of curriculum is locally organized (20% neutral), need based course content (40% neutral), personal interest is considered for teaching portions (40%), allotment of work assignment (40%), convenience of library timings (20% Neutral), etc. The above issues were reported and discussed with Principal and a staff meeting was held for the same. 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STUDENT'S FEEDBACK ON CURRICULUM ANALYSIS REPORT

(APRIL 2023 - NOVEMBER 2023)

The Undergraduate of I Sem BPT, II Sem BPT, III Sem BPT, IV Sem BPT, V Sem BPT, VII Sem BPT, IV Year BPT and postgraduate students of I, II, III Sem MPT filled the Google based feedback forms on curriculum. They responded on total 10 questions regarding the extent of coverage of course, depth of course content, Learning values and skills, availability of Practical and clinical facilities, availability of study materials, University Theory and practical exam &Internal exams, Feedback system to student's performance in exams and opinion about extra-curricular activities. After thorough analysis, Very good, Good& Satisfactory responses were obtained on all domains whereas Unsatisfactory responses were obtained in domains of rating on University theory exam paper content with respect to curriculum (2.8%), rating on University Practical exam paper content with respect to curriculum (4.01%), extra-curricular activities (5.9%).

There were some suggestions given by students which are as follows:

- 1. Less number of modalities such as Muscle Stimulator, pen electrodes are there and also modalities are not working properly.
- 2. Requirement of Water RO Plant with cooler.
- 3. Requirement of Properly working Projectors, Mic systems and speakers
- 4. Permission for central library.
- 5. Requirement of clinical staff for clearing doubts regarding performance of different exercises on patient.
- 6. Allow students to issue more than 1 book at a time from library.

These lacunas were discussed with Principal and suggestions given were:

1. Requirements are reported to authorities and requisitions forwarded.

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- 2. Saturdays are dedicated for "aakaar" activities for improving extracurricular activities.
- 3. More focus is given to practical sessions by improving the practical lecture time to 1Hour.
- Class incharges are instructed to monitor everyday lecture schedule and the members
 of educational unit are instructed to give everyday update on the starting of lecture on
 time.
- Subject incharges are instructed to give regular update to student regarding change in syllabus as well as exam pattern before starting the subject.
- 6. Student participation should be encouraged for extracurricular and sports as well as inter-college events.
- 7. Students will be more involved in research related activities and conferences.
- 8. Various camps and out postings will be arranged for undergraduate as well as post graduate students

STUDENT'S CURRICULUM-FACULTY EVALUATI ON BY STUDENTS ANALYSIS REPORT

(APRIL 2023 - NOVEMBER 2023)

A total of 203 Undergraduate I Sem BPT, II Sem BPT, III Sem BPT, IV Sem BPT, V Sem BPT, VII Sem BPT, IV Year BPT and postgraduate students of I, II, III Sem MPT subjects are been taught by approximately60 teachers (25 teachers from Physiotherapy Department and rest from Medical department). Students have rated the faculty's performance based on the subjects taught by them. They were rated on questions related to knowledge base of teacher, preparation of teach session, communication skills, ability to answer students queries, accessibility to teacher in & out of classroom, ability to design quizzes/tests/assignment etc, fairness of teacher during assessment, etc. After thorough analysis, the maximum feedback response varied from Very good — Good(60-90%) on all the above domains for all teachers while few satisfactory to unsatisfactory responses (0-10%) were obtained on all domains for few teachers in subjects like anatomy (knowledge base of teacher and relevance of content of teaching sessions), Biochemistry(knowledge base of teacher, preparation of teaching sessions by teacher), Physiology (ability to conduct teaching sessions at ideal pace, ability to use different teaching methods, Accessibility of teacher in and out of class, ability to design quiz or test or assignment etc. to evaluate student understanding of the course), Diagnosis of movement dysfunction and ICF (ability to use different teaching methods), Medical and surgical aspects of musculoskeletal disorder (all domains). The above issues were reported and discussed with Principal and a staff meeting was held for the same.

The following steps were taken:

- 1. Medical lectures are taken by Physiotherapy faculty
- 2. CCA are conducted for difficult subjects
- 3. Monthly lesson plans are generated for almost 3months.
- 4. Regular feedbacks are taken from the students as well as by education unit on topic completion, total no. of lectures which are allotted and completed.
- 5. Faculties are instructed to take the student centric method on difficult topics and submit it in a particular time frame.
- Faculty development program will be conducted for the upgradation of different teaching skills, teaching, and learning methods, 21st century learning by Dr. Subhash Khatri sir.

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FACULTY FEEDBACK ANALYSIS REPORT

(APRIL 2023 - NOVEMBER 2023)

About 9 teachers have duly filled the Faulty feedback forms pertaining to 61 subjects of Physiotherapy department (59 subjects) and medical subjects. They responded on questions like structure of curriculum, clearly defined objectives, Course content, Correlation of assessment with syllabus and teaching learning methods, Internal assessment, implementation of newer strategies of teaching learning methods, regular feedback and suggestions taken for curricular designing etc. After thorough analysis, the maximum feedback response varied from Very good — Good (50-80%) on all the above domains for all teachers while few satisfactory to unsatisfactory responses were obtained on domains like Course content is need based (11.1%), Assessment is very well correlated with syllabus and teaching learning method (11.1%), work assignment is allotted equally (11.1%), Library timing is convenient (11.1%). The above issues were reported and discussed with Principal and a staff meeting was held for the same. The following steps were taken:

- Regular feedbacks are taken from the subject incharges and class coordinator on the addition of books, journals and latest addition of books.
- 2. All the faculties are instructed to take SCM activities in given period of time.
- 3. Laboratory incharges are requested to update the equipment list every year and provide requisitions for the new equipments.

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ALUMNI FEEDBACK REPORT

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


1. Extent of coverage of course


2. Depth of the Course content



1. Depth of course content




Impact of Curriculum to develop Learning values. -



Impact of curriculum to develop Learning Skills








9. Rate your University theory exam paper content with respect to curriculum coverage?






University practical exam content






































The responses recorded for this feedback was Three.

100% faculty strongly agree that the objectives are clearly defined in the curriculum.






















The theory syllabus has been rated as very good by 80% of the external examiners and good was the remark given by 20% of them.












