STUDENT SATISFACTION SURVEY (SSS)

INTRODUCTION

IQAC, MGMIHS conducted an online student satisfaction survey (SSS) for the Metric 2.7.1 for AQAR 2023-24 (Period: 1st September 2023 to 31st August 2024). The students of various programs in all constituent units (10) in both campuses (Aurangabad and Navi Mumbai) were requested to provide sincere feedback on the Teaching, Learning, and Evaluation process. 5409 students were on a roll at both campuses (Aurangabad (2216) and Navi Mumbai (3220) of MGMIHS. 2630 responded on Students Satisfaction survey out of which, 1028 (39.1%) students from Aurangabad and 1602 (60.2%) students from Navi Mumbai participated in the survey.










4. To what extent is the mentoring process in your institution beneficial to you for knowledge, social and emotional growth?





The following suggestions were received in SSS, in which students were also asked to provide suggestions to improve the overall Teaching, Learning, and Evaluation process in the institution.

Under Graduate

- 1. Utilize digital tools (e.g., Learning Management Systems, educational software) to supplement traditional teaching, animation based Using visual media
- 2. Use engaging teaching methods like group activities and multimedia to keep students interested. Increase Case based / clinical scenarios-based teaching, one to one doubt solving sessions & practical exposure
- 3. Internal marks evaluation should be done fairly.
- 4. Exam portions should be completed before exam and the dates to be announced in advance
- 5. Diversify assessments with projects, presentations, and peer evaluations instead of just exams.
- 6. Mock Tests on every week / after completion of units, more MCQ tests can give us reality check. More number of written exams to be taken besides the internal exams.

Post Graduate

- 1. More Workshops and Hands-On Sessions.
- 2. Conduct CME and other programs regularly in the college
- 3. Organize department group discussion for leadership roles
- 4. Integration of Technology in Learning: Introduce more digital learning tools like online modules, simulations, and case-based software.
- 5. More classes, group discussions, equal weightage on co curriculum activities
